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From the President

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

It's hard to believe that spring is almost here, even if recent temperatures have given us a nice preview of what lies ahead. As we head deeper into 2018, it's time for all of us to consider some of the biggest challenges and opportunities that we face as a community. I'd love to spend another letter thanking all of the hard-working folks that have helped us over the last few months, but we have a big meeting coming up in the spring and I want to see all of you there!

Our Annual Meeting is less than two months away. In 2017, we saw the largest resident turnout in years, but I know that we can do better in 2018! In addition to the election of three board members, we're preparing an agenda that highlights a lot of the accomplishments of the last year while also focusing on our goals for 2018. It's all a part of our continued efforts to be as accessible to the community as possible while sharing as much information as we can. I hope that you've circled **Wednesday, April 11th** on your calendars – we're very excited to see you!

Now, let's move on to a messier issue . . . parking. There are no two ways about it, there just isn't enough parking in our neighborhood. Between households with commercial vehicles, children that drive, and weekend/project cars, our guest spots are often full. This leads to a lot of hostility and frustration among those that just want a place for their friends and family to park when they come to visit.

As many of you know, a class-action lawsuit alleging predatory towing practices against G&G Towing and other companies left us without any means of enforcing our parking regulations for the better part of the last three years. However, that lawsuit has recently been settled. We are now in the position to decide as a community how we want to deal with parking moving forward. We can look at securing a new contract, but there is risk that goes along with it; if the company that we choose to do business with engages in practices deemed predatory or violates other state or county laws, we could be held liable. We have to decide if that's a risk that we're willing to take, but it isn't a decision that nine people can make for 268 households. We need your input, and we need to start a larger conversation across all of Diamond Farm.

You don't have to wait for the Annual Meeting to offer input, though. Please continue to reach out on Nextdoor, or through our website, or email. Stop by the informal happy hour scheduled for **Wednesday, March 7th**, at the Buffalo Wild Wings just up the street! It'll be a great chance to relax and meet other residents outside of a tiny meeting room or school cafeteria. Remember, at the end of the day, we're all just neighbors.

Recent Board Meeting Notes

November

- The tree survey conducted by ETC was confirmed as having begun.
- The board approved a Code of Conduct for all directors, present and future.
- A list of tows conducted by G&G on behalf of DFHC was reviewed; while none were conducted illegally, it was determined that the corporation could face future liability if subsequent contractors aren't monitored and violate any laws or regulations concerning towing.

December

- The ACC committee, chaired by Matt Ovington, has begun conducting the resale inspections for home sales in Diamond Farm, saving the community \$75 per inspection.
- Several residents have expressed concerns over drivers ignoring the stop signs entering and exiting Diamond Farm. Residents can report traffic violations through the City's CITE program at http://www.gaithersburgmd.gov/services/online-services/cite
- Mike Turow, Treasurer, reported an operational loss of approximately \$12,000 for FY2017 due to the FY2017 budget using contract figures from FY2016.

January

- Irek Zawadski suggested an idea for a community garden to be maintained in one of the abandoned plots of the Pepco field.
- A Nominating Committee was created to handle ballots and information for the upcoming election. Pat Butler was appointed chair of the committee.
- The final budget for FY2017 was reviewed and showed an actual loss of approximately \$1,500.
- The results of the Montgomery County meetings and planned changes to laws surrounding shortterm rentals (AirBNB, VRBO, etc.) were shared and reviewed. Though feedback was solicited from communities within the county, the board declined to take an official position on the matter.
- Plans for the election and annual meeting were discussed, including two proposed amendments to the governing documents.

FY2018 Budget Adoption

In November, the board held an annual budget meeting to solicit comments and feedback on the proposed budget for 2018. At the conclusion of the meeting, the attending board members voted 6-1 to adopt the budget. Trash/Recycling/Bulk Pickup Dates

The board and our management company continue to receive complaints and notifications from our residents concerning trash, recycling, and bulk pickup items. Please remember that items should not be put out earlier than 7pm on the evening before the collection day. This includes bulk items, which are only collected once on the first Friday of every month. Cleaning Up After Your Dogs

Recently, the number of complaints relating to dogs in and around our community have increased as well. The majority of these relate to owners cleaning up after their dogs. Not only is pet waste an eyesore and an unpleasant surprise for anyone who happens to walk through it, but it can attract flies and other pests that carry disease. Please remember to carry waste bags with you when you walk your dog, and please remember to dispose of those bags properly. Gaithersburg law requires that pet owners pick up after their pets and will fine owners \$100 per instance if reported and confirmed. Residents can report violations to Gaithersburg Animal Control at 301-258-6343.

Snow & Ice Shoveling

We've managed to get through most of this winter with only light snow fall, but there's still time for more! The city plows our streets and we have a contract for snow removal on the community paths and sidewalks. However, the sidewalks in front of or adjacent to houses are the responsibility of the resident. This includes end unit houses that sit on corner lots.

Please ensure that you are complying with the city's regulations and have any snow and ice removed from your sidewalks within 12 hours of any snowfall. Remember that others use the sidewalk in front of/beside your house – neighbors going for a walk, pet owners exercising their animals, children heading to the bus stop – all types of people need a safe path through our community. Clearing your sidewalk isn't just a city requirement, it's a considerate and neighborly thing to do that benefits everyone.

While trimming of trees and bushes has ground to a halt for the cold months, the committee continues to patrol the grounds for downed branches and other issues. One big item that will help the committee, as well as the Board, is the recent completion of a comprehensive tree inventory. This consisted of a qualified professional inspecting and numbering every tree on the common grounds of the community (for a grand total of 568 trees!). We now have a map of all of the trees along with a spreadsheet listing the type of tree (oak, pine, etc.), as well as any issues that could require attention. The Maintenance Committee definitely will be using this resource to prioritize various issues with our trees.

Currently the committee consists of only two members. We would definitely like to see at least one more member of the community get involved with the committee and help out with determining what issues there are on the common grounds and how to prioritize them. If you are not able to commit to being a full committee member or are just looking to get a little exercise a few times a month, we would also like to entertain volunteers to help patrol the grounds, gather up downed branches and place them at the curb for Friday morning pickup, and assist with moving branches trimmed by committee members to the curb for pickup.
